I've been rethinking the Sturgis Rally. This year it runs from August 3rd to the 9th. It is the 75th continuous year of the worlds most famous get together of bikers. There are so many events to attend and see that they are too numerous to list here.

I just spoke to a friend of mine about his adventures last year. He told me about the great parade through Sturgis and on the freeway led by the local cops. They completely close down the roads and only the 20,000 or so bikes are on the highway. He said it was a sight to see and a lot of fun.

I've been to Sturgis 6 times in the last dozen years and each trip was a different adventure.

One year we stopped at the entrance to Zion National Park and a group of mostly Japanese tourists swarmed around us and our bikes, asked to sit on our bikes and

took a lot of pictures. It was a fun event for all of us, and, of course, we rode through Zion National Park and thoroughly enjoyed all of the sights. Through Grand Junction Colorado and Denver. Past Cheyenne Wyoming and heading towards our goal.

Once in Sturgis there are so many things to do and places to go. Turning off the freeway onto Lazelle street the vendors are lined up on both sides and we haven't even reached Main street yet where bikes are lined up for 10 blocks on both sides of the street and 2 parking lanes in the center. Lots and lots of vendors and street eats. Not to mention all of the big bike suppliers and bike builders.

People selling pin striping kits to customize your bike. Booths to change your oil or change your tires. Need a tune-up? Get one there plus a new ignition system and hot pipes.

Sturgis or bust?

Then there's Full Throttle Saloon where the girls are wearing short shorts and skimpy tops and dance on the bar between serving cold beer and drinks to the thirsty crowd. And where else can you ride your bike right into the middle of the venue?

Did I talk about the Buffalo Chip campground about 3 miles past the main drag? Evenings are a hoot with lots of burn-outs on the main path into and out of the place. Bikes going slowly down the road with their passengers going topless and less, collecting beads as they go.

Seventeen miles away is Deadwood, SD. and the bar where Wild Bill Hickock was shot holding the infamous poker hand of Aces and Eights, also known as the 'Dead man's hand'. Deadwood is also a town where the last great gold rush began in 1874.

Then on to Mount Rushmore. What seems like every bike in the country is heading down that road and you have to endure the worst traffic jam ever and the heat is burning your inner thighs until all of a sudden you see the famous etching in the mountains high above and your breath is taken away by the majesty of this great sculpture. You find a spot on the side of the road to stop and just stare at the magnificent sight. I still have pictures that I treasure and remind me of the great time I had.

Spearfish loop. There's nothing more to say. A beautiful 20 mile, or so, scenic trip through the local mountains with waterfalls and lots of great sights.

Time to go home and it's west to Cody, Wy. Named after Wild Bill the great explorer. A great place to spend the night and go to the rodeo and enjoy the cowboy shoot-out on the

main street (every night at 6:00 pm). Continuing west we get to ride through Yellowstone National Park and stop at the great geyser - "Old Faithful". While it doesn't go off every 20 minutes, it's close enough to be worth the wait. The first time I saw it there was a little spurt of hot water spilling out on the ground. Then another little bigger spurt. Then after a short wait a little smaller one. I figured that was it and not the big deal I was expecting. Just as I started to leave another spurt, then another, and all of a sudden it was like a giant one and a whole bunch followed that one and then it went on for another 10 minutes. It was spectacular!!! A wonderful natural phenomenon not to be missed.

Then through to Utah and northern Nevada & stops in Reno and Lake Tahoe and perhaps San Francisco for another day of relaxation and sight-seeing. Down the coast and heading toward home. More stops on the way and maybe a night in Monterey before the last leg home.

Heading down the 101 after 10 to 15 days on the road and you can't help but think about what a fun trip this has been with great friends. You ruminate about how we just missed that big storm heading straight toward us then miraculously turned east and just missed us. The weather, while hot at times, was pretty darn good except for that first day through Vegas to Mesquite where we thought we were going to actually melt and have to be scraped up off the 2000 degree pavement.

Maybe I was a little put off last month by the possible minor problems a great trip like this presents, but overall, the fun and entertainment of Sturgis far outweighs the minor inconveniences presented.
