### Fatal Motorcycle Crash Takes Life Of Ojai Man

An Ojai man was killed Monday when a piece of clothing got caught in the wheel of his Harley Davidson motorcycle and caused him to crash.

Ronnie Gene Hagar, 59, was traveling northbound on the I-5, approaching Vista Del Lago Road at approximately 4:25 pm, when an article of clothing secured to the sissy bar became dislodged and got hung up in the rear spokes.

Hagar lost control of the motorcycle and struck the concrete K-rail adjacent to the right lane. He was thrown from the bike on to the right shoulder of the road.

He was airlifted to Henry Mayo Newhall Memorial Hospital by LA County Fire personnel and was pronounced dead at 5:25 pm.

The incident remains under investigation.

MAG-LITE. I know, you've seen it a thousand times but did you know.....?

The company is right here in So. Cal., in Ontario.

They manufacture about a dozen types of flashlights and is the first company to redesign the traditional flashlight and turn it into an efficient finely engineered device.

My 2 cell LED flashlight has functions built-in to it that will surprise. Yes, it does more than just turn on and become an adjustable flashlight. It can also work as a strobe light, it can have 2 light levels and it can be used as an automatic emergency flasher sending out an international SOS signal. Originally SOS meant "Save Our Ship" and has become the correct way to signal trouble on air, sea, and land.

My grandson is a flashlight fanatic and got me interested into looking at a very nice Mag-Lite. In the process I discovered something great.

Mag-Lite makes several models of the LED XL series. The XL200 is the latest and greatest of the bunch. It works off of 3 AAA batteries and will last for 2 1/2 hours! It puts out 172 lumens of light. Compare this to a typical 3 D cell flashlight and, well, there is no comparison. This small flashlight will fit in your hand easily and will light up the night like a floodlight. Functions include: regular flashlight with adjustable intensity, strobe light with adjustable flash rate, Night lite ( it will last for 218 hours on low and turn on high when you grab it), and international SOS.

It weighs a little over 3.5 ounces and is light enough to carry in your purse or pocket.

*Remember. IF YOU SEE SOMETHING YOU LIKE, BUY IT*

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
I checked out Home Depot but they did not have the XL-200 model in store.

The guard takes their order and apologizes that there are so few items on the menu: "So sorry, but if there are five of you we add Pea Chow Yuk and Sauté-Mandarin Beef!"

And so it began; our own great SCHRA Chinatown Adventure, admonishing the use of motorcycles but requiring the Red and Gold-Line Subways instead.

The NoHo weather that Saturday, August 11 afternoon was both hot and muggy, but 18 brave souls finally made it to the Subway station and descended to the always-problematic electronic ticket dispensers. After much probing and button-pushing we were finally able to extract enough tickets to make us all legal as we coasted in the darkness to Union Station and then on the "elevated" to Chinatown Station, followed by a 2-block walk to the Plaza.

Our Neon Cruise was not to begin until 7:30 and our arrival at Chinatown's Hop-Louie Golden Pagoda Restaurant was just short of 6:00 PM. Plenty of time to toss down a few Tsingchows and then enjoy an authentic Los Angeles-style

Chinese Dinner, whose multiple courses just kept on coming. Unlike the poor souls in the Chinese prison, we were numerous enough to qualify for almost everything the kitchen offered. The food was excellent, the ambiance of our private room was lovely, the wait-service was outstanding, and the price was quite reasonable (4-checks for our group of 18).

Outside the restaurant, the crowds in the Plaza were starting to build. We were informed that our cruise-date of Saturday, August 11 coincided with another event which happens just three times per month, and only during July and August. Dance bands were tuning up, street vendors were setting-up camp and in addition to the numerous Asian Restaurants in the plaza, the gourmet food vans were also on site adjacent to the Plaza. In short, it was an added feature to our evening and we all had about 45 minutes to enjoy the music and the people-watching.

As advertised, the huge upper-deck-only bus was almost on time and loaded directly in front of the Plaza (on Broadway) in the heart of all the music, party-goers and little Asian and Hispanic kids with faces smeared with ice-cream. Everybody was having fun and we were still in anticipation of our "cruise" to come. By 8:00 PM our bus was



fully seated (44 people in all) and we were introduced to our decent "docent - Eric" who talked virtually non-stop for the entire three hour tour.

Although advertised as a "neon cruise," my suspicion was that there had to be more than just neon lights to talk about, and we were not disappointed. Eric provided one of the most comprehensive tours of Downtown L.A., Hollywood, and everything in-between. He pointed out the his-



chopped liver, pickles, and chocolate-chip Danish. Hey, why only a 15-minute break??!!

The trip back to downtown was almost totally along Wilshire Blvd. where the Saturday Night crowds were much in evidence. What's this thing about street people shouting as open-air buses pass by? 


Summer Party JB


